

Level 3 Award: Safeguarding Adults (POVA) Trainer

Aim of Training

This award provides practical skills on training, coaching and developing others on the knowledge required to support individuals in danger of abuse or neglect in accordance with Common Induction Standard (CIS) 5: *Recognise and Respond to Abuse & Neglect*.

This course is for

Those working within the health and social care sector who have a responsibility to coach and train others to meet the criteria of the CIS 5. This course will assist those who do not hold a formal teaching/training qualification and would benefit from an understanding of the learning process and to develop facilitation skills.

Structure

This award comprises of two units of 5 Learning Outcomes. The award is 12 guided learning hours, including a 3-hour content specific, interactive workshop, and 3-hours of presentation/training skills. An additional 6 hours to include reading, assessment and on-line work sheets.

Assessment

Achievement of the learning outcomes is assessed internally. All assessment criteria must be met in order to achieve the learning outcomes.

Content (unit 1)

The focus is on the knowledge base of the topic Safeguarding Adults, and will include:

- Legislation, Policies & Procedures e.g. Whistle Blowing, POVA
- Definition of Abuse
- Who is at risk of abuse
- Types of Abuse & Forms of Abuse
- Strategies to avoid abuse
- What to do if abuse is suspected, or reported - Alerters flowchart
- Completing body maps

Content (unit 2)

The focus is on the skills required of an effective trainer on the topic of Safeguarding Adults, and will include:

- The learning process
- Effective icebreakers
- Session planning
- Charting skills
- Delivery skills and practice
- Completing assessments & feedback
- Facilitating group work

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Learning Outcomes (unit 1)

- Understand the nature of abuse and neglect
- Recognise the signs & symptoms of abuse and neglect
- Describe how to monitor individuals at risk of abuse
- Understand how to respond to suspected abuse or neglect
- Outline how to access current Legislation, Policies & Procedures e.g. Whistle Blowing

Learning Outcomes (unit 2)

- Demonstrate an understanding of professional practice
- Prepare clearly structured training sessions
- Display technical delivery skills
- Monitor learners to establish level of learning
- Evaluate own practises in relation to current & future developments

Entry Requirements
