

Safeguarding Adults (SOVA) Trainer Programme

Aim of Training

This award provides practical skills on training, coaching and developing others in the knowledge required to support individuals at risk of abuse or neglect.

This course is for

Those working within the health and social care sector who have a responsibility to coach and train others to Common Induction Standard 6. This course will assist those who do not hold a formal teaching/training qualification and would benefit from an understanding of the learning process and to develop facilitation skills.

Structure

The programme includes a three hour content specific, interactive workshop, and three hours of presentation/training skills. It is designed to incorporate the content of the safeguarding adults knowledge set released by Skills For Care in 2007.

Assessment

Achievement of the learning outcomes is assessed internally. All assessment criteria must be met in order to achieve the learning outcomes.

Content (Interactive workshop)

The focus is on the knowledge base of the topic Safeguarding Adults, and will include:

- Definition of Abuse
- Types of Abuse
- Forms of Abuse
- Signs of Abuse
- Four point approach
- Alerter's flowchart
- Legislation
- Completing body maps

Content (Trainer programme)

The focus is on the skills required of an effective trainer on the topic of Safeguarding Adults, and will include:

- The learning process
- Effective icebreakers
- Session planning
- Charting skills
- Delivery skills and practice
- Completing assessments & feedback
- Facilitating group work

Learning Outcomes (Interactive Workshop)

- Understand the nature of abuse and neglect
- Recognise the signs & symptoms of abuse and neglect
- Describe how to monitor individuals at risk of abuse
- Understand how to respond to suspected abuse or neglect
- Outline how to access current Legislation, Policies & Procedures e.g. Whistle Blowing

Learning Outcomes (Trainer programme)

- Demonstrate an understanding of professional practice
- Prepare clearly structured training sessions
- Display technical delivery skills
- Monitor learners to establish level of learning
- Evaluate own practises in relation to current & future developments

Progression

Direct progression onto the Preparing to Teach in the Lifelong Learning Sector (PTLLS) programme

Entry Requirements

The minimum age limit for learners wishing to take this programme is 16 years. It is essential that applicants have a minimum of Level 2 Key skills in literacy, communication and ICT.
